

Hot off the press - Bird Prize finalist!



The finalists for the Holmes Prize for Excellence in Realistic Australian Bird Art (quite a mouthful!) were announced on the 19th September and my white-throated treecreepers made the cut! Entries have been narrowed down to just 40 artworks, and include work from some of the most talented bird artists in the country, so it's a massive honour for me to be included. The exhibition will be held on the Sunshine Coast, QLD in October, more details to follow!

A little about this artwork 'Treecreeping'. It's a 12 x 16 inch ink on scratchboard and was inspired by a recent camping trip to Kaputar National Park near Narrabri - absolute heaven for keen birders and nature lovers in general - if you haven't been, do put it on your list!

I was having some quiet time near the summit of Mt Kaputar whilst my hubby and daughter hiked to a nearby peak. I'd spotted a treecreeper scruffling up a large tree earlier, but I was loving watching a large, chatty group of thornbills that were having a field day amongst the leaf litter and tree bark. As I turned to follow some thornbill antics, I caught a glimpse of a treecreeper probing the bark on an ancient-looking teatree only a few metres away. Treecreepers are apparently quite solitary outside of mating season, but I wanted to create an artwork showcasing both a male and female...particularly the female's blush of red-orange on her cheek! The pattern on their belly is also beautiful and their long claws are very impressive - such an underrated bird I think. So this artwork has been created by cobbling together quite a few reference photos from that stunning close encounter.

Short-listed for 2023 Sketch for Survival

In more happy news received earlier in the month, 'Better the devil you know' has been shortlisted (top 100) for Explorers Against Extinction's 2023 Sketch for Survival!

That means that this little fella will be exhibited in Edinburgh and London in October/November and it will then be auctioned off, with all money raised going towards EAE's wildlife conservation projects - a most worthy cause that I am so happy to be involved in!

On the drawing board - new artworks



Here are the latest finished pieces and works in progress - I finally cracked open my watercolour paints to experiment with an Ampersand Aquabord - a sister product to Ampersand scratchboard. It's also on a masonite base with a textured clay surface that takes watercolour just like watercolour paper, without the buckling issues! The result is my emu 'Bush chook' above, who is available for sale, just not on my web shop yet. The paper daisies and wattle pieces have sold but the appleberry (top left) will be available for sale at Bowral (see below), and my treecreepers will be available at the Holmes Bird Prize exhibition. I finally finished 'Wally', my little 5x7 inch koala, and he's now available here.
