## 'Bush tucker treat' receives 2nd prize in Bowral



In early October, the opening of the CanAssist Botanical Art and Illustration Prize exhibition was held at historic Retford Park in Bowral, NSW. Although I couldn't make it, I was delighted to receive the initial news that my scratchboard of the common appleberry, Billardiera scandens, had sold on opening day. Then more exciting news to say that it had won 2nd prize!

This is a plant and composition that I've wanted to capture in scratchboard for a long time, so it was very special to see it so well received. I adore this plant so much that I had a seedling shipped from Melbourne Bushfoods a couple of years back, and I'm happy to report that it is still thriving in our back garden!

'Treecreeping' receives Award of Excellence



In late October, my husband and I flew to Queensland for the weekend to attend the opening of the Holmes Prize for Realistic Australian Bird Art. I went into the evening just happy to be there to celebrate making it to the top 40 finalists, and delightedly meeting talented artists that I'd only known through social media. And walking into the exhibition itself was impressive, the bird art on display is truly some of the best you'll find in Australia. The prize is generously funded by Dr Gary Holmes and his wife Dr Margaret Anderson, who share a love of realistic bird art and recognised the absence of a major prize that celebrated it.

This year's judge was Steve Morvell (pictured above), an internationally recognised wildlife artist, who gave a fabulous, heartfelt talk on an artist's connection to their subject and the importance of that connection to create powerful artworks that really engage the viewer. I think I dropped a minor profanity when he called out my name for an Award of Excellence - the next 10 minutes or so after that are a bit of a blur. I stumbled through a quick thank you speech and ended up rambling about our camping trip to Kaputar - the shock and elation were real, and lasted well into the following week!

I'm so very grateful for this entire experience, and highly recommend any artists who enjoy painting and drawing our spectacular birdlife to throw your hat in the ring, you just never know!
